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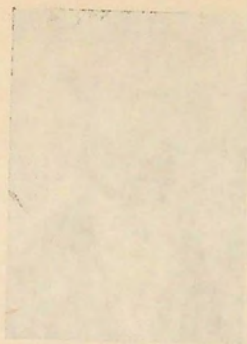
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CHARTER

ARTICLE I

Section 1
All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 3
The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators in that State.

Section 4
The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or change in any or all of those Things the Times, Places and Manner of holding such Elections, except the Place of Elections for the House of Representatives.

Section 5
The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments. When sitting for that Purpose, they shall be on Oath or Affirmation. The Judgment shall not extend further than to remove the Officer accused, or to disqualify him for future Office.

Section 6
The Senators and Representatives shall receive for their Services a Compensation, which shall be ascertained by Law. But no Increase of Compensation shall take Effect until the next Election of the House of Representatives.

Section 7
No Senator or Representative shall be a Member of any other Body which may be constituted by the United States, or any State, during the Time for which he was elected.

Section 8
The Congress shall have Power to lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to pay the Debts and provide for the common Defence and general Welfare of the United States; but all Duties, Imposts and Excises shall be uniform throughout the United States.

Section 9
The Congress shall have Power to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, and among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes.

Section 10
No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance or Confederation; or grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal; or coin Money; or emit Bills of Credit; or make any Thing but gold and silver Coin a Tender in Payment of Debts.

Section 11
No State shall be obliged to furnish Troops for the Service of the United States, unless the Congress shall have first passed a Law authorizing the same.

Section 12
No State shall be liable for the Debt or Debts of any other State.
